ORLANDO -- Orlando-based lawyer and congressional candidate Alan Grayson has reached an \$8.9 million settlement with a defense contractor accused of defrauding the federal government.

The settlement ends a two-year legal battle brought against IIF Data Solutions by a former employee turned whistle-blower. IIF is a Virginia-based contractor that was hired to provide technical and professional support for the National Guard.

Grayson's client alleged that the company misrepresented its experience and overbilled.

Under terms of the settlement, the company admitted no wrongdoing and Grayson agreed not to disparage IIF.

Grayson, who is seeking the Democratic nomination to run against U.S. Rep. Ric Keller, R-Orlando, last year won a \$10 million verdict against another defense contractor in connection with work it was doing in Iraq.
